For your information, we are in discussions with other disruptive car-sharing companies (Lyft/Sidecar etc.) to explore how they might launch into the UK market. I've looked into this following your email yesterday afternoon.

TfL has received a complaint about the business practices employed by Uber, who are a private hire operator licensed by us under London Taxi and Private Hire legislation. As a result we have undertaken an investigation into their operational working practices, which has uncovered a number of issues we are now seeking to clarify/resolve with them.

Whilst some of these are relatively straight-forward to resolve, some relate to legal interpretations of current private hire legislation on which TfL and Uber have currently different views. As a result, a meeting has now been arranged between them and my Chief Operating Officer for Surface Transport, Garrett Emmerson to work through these issues. This meeting due to take place this Friday 10th.

I can confirm that Uber is co-operating fully with us in working through these issues and, at this stage, I would be reasonably confident that they can be resolved to our mutual satisfaction. However, as I'm sure you will appreciate as the regulator of all private hire operators, vehicles and drivers in London, TfL must reserve its position with regard to possible future enforcement action if there is no agreement.

I will make sure you get an update on where we are with this after this coming Friday's meeting.

Priya Guha has recommended I reach out to you for some advice regarding a fdi project I am working on - Uber.

You can see the email below from Corey Owens (Head of Global Public Policy at Uber) that they have been contacted by TfL and been threatened to have their license to operate in London revoked. Specifically, they've asserted that the iPhone is a taximeter, and non-taxi services can't use a taximeter.

Corey is flying to London this week to meet with TfL's COO but has told us they have been told repeatedly by TfL compliance staff that 1) the pressure is coming from "the trades" and 2) that these decisions are being made at TfL "above their pay grade."

Do you have any advice on how we might help or someone they can speak to about this within the Department for Transport, Number 10 or anyone else of relevance?
