I have been using the Northern Line for over thirty years and believe that it was never as loud in the past as it is now. I am writing with regard to not one single journey but to a repeated, regular journey that I make at least 4 times a week, twice a day, either to old street or carrying on further to London Bridge station, as described on your form entries.

I am deeply alarmed and continuously disturbed by the recent (in regard to living on this line for the last 11 years) increase in , let us describe it as, noise from carriage friction against the tracks in specific locations along this journey. It is intolerable at its decibel level. I have taken to wearing earplugs that guarantee a 25dB reduction in background noise levels in order to bear the journey. I am seriously concerned about preventing hearing damage. It is not a nuisance level of sound, it is painful and occurring on every journey I make. It is not circumstantial.

I work within the construction industry and have an understanding and tolerance for much. But this is quite intolerable, without there being some background information as to why this might be occurring or for how long. My suspicion is it has a connection to construction works for cross rail, possibly changing acoustics as a result of including greater steelwork below sections of northern line rails. If not, then related to recent track works to the northern line. It always occurs coming in and out of Euston. Also on leaving Camden Town, also approaching London Bridge.

I am also seriously concerned that if the whole portion of noise level can be defined as being down to track friction, it may pose a fire risk. We need reassurances from TFL.

It is essential that some explanation is found and the results passed on to travellers with some idea of how long we must suffer this. Or customers, should you insist. I certainly don't feel I have a choice in not using the tube in London in order to have a functioning day.

I am happy to record noise levels if you wish to have evidence.

As a regular Northern Line user I am most concerned that the noise identified in my earlier compliant is substantially worse. It is most acute southbound into

Euston via Bank, northbound from Euston via Bank, northbound leaving Warren Street and northbound from Kentish Town. There are other locations. In each instance the noise is painful. My wife and I put our fingers into our ears to reduce the considerable discomfort.

I notice other passengers are doing the same. Added to the noise level there is a rolling vibration that can be felt through the floor of the moving carriage.

No doubt there are complex technical reasons for the considerable recent increase in noise. Among them, I suppose, new inverted T section rails, and increased operating speeds.

Since the noise is increasing I cannot accept the explanations given in your reply. Would you please advise me therefore how I may escalate this complaint?

In particular I would like to know if this matter has been drawn to the attention of the Health and Safety Executive, and whether independent noise level readings have been supplied?

This has been a noticeable feature of travel on this line between Kings Cross to Tufnell Park on the Edgeware Branch line and Euston to Tufnell Park on the High Barnet Branch for well over 9 months and seems to be getting worse daily. Having measured it TFL are continues to breach current safety sound levels...and something must be done as a matter of urgency.. you are certainly contributing to long term damage to underground travelers hearing. I look forward to hearing what solutions TFL are investigating and look forward with eager anticipation to a quieter ride!!

Thank you for your reply to my complaint about noise. I am not satisfied with your response. There is no sense of urgency about mitigating or fixing the noise problem affecting the health and wellbeing of your passengers and staff. Trains running on sections of track, in particular between Euston - Charing Cross and Bank branches, and Archway in both directions generate very high and unsafe levels of noise. The noise is painful, and I have observed passengers covering their ears; children especially. The noise measurements you quote "we recorded levels of 98-103dB between Kentish Town and Tufnell Park" are in the unsafe range. This high noise exposure lasts for a significant time and is bracketed by relatively lower but nonetheless uncomfortable noise. Noise levels have increased, for example between Camden and Kentish Town Northbound recently and the noise is more prolonged. I have not been exposed to high noise levels at work or otherwise. Yet I now experience continuous tinnitus and have a measurable hearing loss. I suspect this was caused by the recent increase in noise on the Underground. Consequently I now avoid using the Underground, and if I do I protect my ears. Track noise is exacerbated by very loud repet<BLEEP>tive automated announcements. As a matter of Freedom of Information I would appreciate a response to the questions numbered below: 1. Are the increased noise levels associated with rail replacement? 2. Was there any testing or modelling of noise when the new rail systems were commissioned? Retrospective fitting of softer rail fastenings suggests that rail renewal was not thought through. This level of noise was not an issue when running on the old bull head and wooden sleeper rail system. 3. Since the noise levels are in the danger range what action are you taking now to protect passenger and driver health and safety? For example speed reductions, advice to passengers, recommendations regarding ear protection. 4. Have you consulted the Trade Unions regarding noise harm to staff? On a separate matter I have noticed accumulations of dust and fluff at many underground stations. I am concerned about risks to health and that accumulations of fluff near electrical apparatus could result in smouldering fire.

I presume others must have complained (including drivers), as I have seen other people with their hands on their ears too. Have any measurements been taken as to how loud it is? If there is a reason it has started to happen, are there going to be any remedial works to minimise the sound? Many thanks.



Thank you for your email and the reply to complaint. I have to say that I cannot accept the reasoning behind your explanation as the Northern Line has been in existence for over 100 years. Accordingly, the people living above it would have known when they purchased/rented their property that there would be vibration and noise from the railway below. I believe that the paying passengers comfort should take priority over that of a few complaining residents particularly with excessive high fares for a hot and overcrowded service. Thus, I contend that in striking a balance the priorities are wrong.

Please can you give me an update on this situation. According to the HSE which refers to ISO 1999:2013 (and to an ENT surgeon I spoke to), the allowable duration reduces by a factor of 2 for every 3db over 85db, which means that the allowable duration at 121db is 7 seconds and at 124db is 3.5 seconds. Also higher frequency noise (as is the case) is more damaging for peaks. The duration of the noise easily exceeds these durations on the Northern line at the moment. I notice some of the drivers are wearing ear protection. You certainly have a duty of care towards the drivers and I don't believe you have no legal responsibility towards your passengers. Passengers are covering their ears as the noise is actually painful and on this basis and above I am convinced this is detrimental to health. I look forward to hearing from you. Dear I appreciate your response with regards to the Northern Line noise, but I beg to differ with what you say re 'it's highly unlikely to cause damage to health or hearing.' This is simply not true. As a tinnitus sufferer, my hearing /health gets damaged every time I'm exposed to the sort of noise levels which I experience on this section of the Northern Line. For hours after a journey my ears will 'spike'. This is common when anyone with tinnitus is exposed to a very noise; the buzzing noise from the tinnitusgets a lot louder. As are sult sufferers might hear additional tones or noises that weren't there before. This is true in my case. My tinnitus means I can't go to music concerts, the IMAX cinema, or many other public places because of the issues it causes for my ears. I can elect whether or not to go to such events, but I cannot - and should not be expected to — make alternative travel arrangements for my commute to and from central London simply because the tube is too noisy for people's ears, in particular for tinnitus sufferers' ears. You will know that the decibel levels have been measured and reported by the Camden New Journal, and they are at the same levels as a loud rock concert. So I take great offence to the suggestion that TFL staff and its customers should accept such ear-splitting noise as, to your reply, 'although the noise is unpleasant, it only lasts for short durations.' Are you saying what I think you're saying here, that thousands of people, paying huge sums to use the Tube, are to simply grin and bear it? I cannot accept this. Not should I have to. Last week, in my carriage, I observed that 1/3 of the passengers covered their ears in order to cope with the noise levels. Mothers with small children, old people, and every age in between. That is not right. Please don't suggest ear plugs or noise blockers. I don't need them for any other Tube line journey that I take; what I am asking is that TFL do it's job and make the Northern Line sound-safe for all concerned, ie its employees and its passengers. This is simply not true. As a tinnitus sufferer, my hearing /health gets damaged every time I'm exposed to the sort of noise levels which I experience on this section of the Northern Line. For hours after a journey my ears will 'spike'. This is common when anyone with tinnitus is exposed to a very noise; the buzzing noise from the tinnitusgets a lot louder. As aresult sufferers might hear additional tones or noises that weren't there before. This is true in my case. My tinnitus means I can't go to music concerts, the IMAX cinema, or many other public places because of the issues it causes for my ears. I can elect whether or not to go to such events, but I cannot - and should not be expected to — make alternative travel arrangements for my commute to and from central London simply because the tube is too noisy for people's ears, in particular for tinnitus sufferers' ears. You will know that the decibel levels have been measured and reported by the Camden New Journal, and they are at the same levels as a loud rock concert. So I take great offence to the suggestion that TFL staff and its customers should accept such ear-splitting noise as, to your reply, 'although the noise is unpleasant, it only lasts for short durations.' Are you saying what I think you're saying here, that thousands of people, paying huge sums to use the Tube, are to simply grin and bear it? I cannot accept this. Not should I have to. Last week, in my carriage, I observed that 1/3 of the passengers covered their ears in order to cope with the noise levels. Mothers with small children, old people, and every age in between. That is not right. Please don't suggest ear plugs or noise blockers. I don't need them for any other Tube line journey that I take; what I am asking is that TFL do it's job and make the Northern Line sound-safe for all concerned, ie its employees and its passengers. Please pass my communications on to the highest level, this issue is not going to go away until TFL solves the problem.

This message is correctly and not too loud. In Paris it is a low male voice and much quieter. The engineer maybe thought the voice has to peak the loudest noise from outside on the route of the Northern line. But maybe the engineer should stand under a loudspeaker between Clapham South and Balham. This word Balham is loudest on the whole journey. I think a NHS staff testing the noise level for ears would say the same when he holds a device under the loudspeaker at a distance of 10 cm. I think a lot of people think the same but do not write an email. But I thank again for a very good and punctual Northern line Service. Kind regards







Thank you for your reply to my email. I am glad something is being done to reduce the noise, but it seems such a contradiction that reducing noise levels above ground will increase them below ground. Also so far, I cannot say that the work engineers are doing to reduce the noise on the tracks is effective- as of yesterday 22nd April when I travelled on the northern line, there was still screeching on the track in the same place. It also seems improbable that there is no statutory noise level on the underground, it is a place of work for many. I hope your drivers are issued with noise reducing ear phones. I continue to request that this problem will be dealt with sooner rather than later, as I stated before, it cannot be good for anyone's hearing, or the tracks of the trains. Yours sincerely

Thank you for your email. I have to disagree with you. The noise does NOT last for a short period of time; it lasts for at least 20 seconds – 50 seconds. Thursday evening travelling Northwards on the Northern line, I saw three elderly people screw up their faces and stick their fingers in their ears. The noise is intolerable. It should not be accepted under Health & Safety. I suggest you take a trip on the line yourself between: Tufnell Park - Kentish Town - Camden Town - Mornington Crescent (less noise here but still noisy) - Euston (Charring Cross) Tufnell Park - Kentish Town - Camden Town - Euston (Bank) Why are people living in properties above the Northern Line more important than your passengers, who are also your clients? I am quite sure their eardrums are not being assaulted in the same way as your passengers. You need to find a way which suits both groups of people. Very simply, why not ask your drivers to slow down between these stations? The noise becomes worse the greater the speed. I look forward to hearing from you. In you reply below you said you hoped there would be some noise mitigation in place in the Kentish Town area by March. I'm here to tell you that if it's in place it isn't working! If anything the noise is getting worse, and spreading to other areas of the track. I often see children and other people grimacing and putting their fingers in their ears to try to shut out the noise, and several passengers have taken to wearing ear defenders (not just noise cancelling headphones, actual ear defenders such as are used to reduce noise on rifle ranges, building sites and suchlike). Measurements of up to 109db have been taken and if reports are right (eg http://camdennewjournal.com/article/northern-line-tube-racket-like-being-at-a-rock-concert) LUL at least tacitly recognises the potential damage by issuing its drivers with ear defenders. It has got to the stage that if I have a reasonable alternative route that doesn't involve the tube around Camden Town I will take it, purely because of the irritation and potential damage that may be being caused. For children with developing ears it must be even more impactful. Please let me know if the mitigating measures have indeed been installed as you outlined below, and if so what else LUL are planning as it clearly isn't working!

It's a welcome change to get something other than a form letter brush-off these days. One can put up with something much more easily if one knows there is a good reason for it. It might be useful to publicise this information more widely to pacify other tube users? Just a couple of points... What happened in "the last couple of years"? The tube has been running this route since 1907 after all! Web search results (eg https://muradqureshi.com/updated-tube-noise-map/) suggest that noise has generally increased in the last few years. I guess it's also connected with the London Assembly call for noise level reductions in 2017, and the later running of tubes with the Night Tube? Have things improved for residents, and are they suitably grateful? You say there are no regulations on noise on the Tube. The Control of Noise at Work Regs 2005 only applies to employees, not 'customers' (or passengers, as I like to still call us😉) surely, but there are generally accepted HSE maximum levels, eg 85db. This article from the BBC (https://www.bbc.co.uk/news/uk-england-london-) is relevant, although I accept the situation is a bit more complicated than this. Even if regular commuters are not

likely to experience actual hearing damage, they are certainly experiencing discomfort and distress. You are of course caught between a rock and a hard place, between noise disturbance to above ground individuals and to passengers, but which is the larger affected population? Passengers, I would suggest. Let's hope noise reduction trials go well and quickly. You only have to look at the faces of travellers on the affected areas to see how unpleasant we are finding tube travel on parts of the network – even my Bose noise-cancelling headphones are not effective in shutting out the din! Your own guidelines require hearing protection for tube employees exposed to noise levels of 85dB and above. As 111dB is approximately four HUNDRED (!) times as loud as 85dB this kind of daily and frequently recurring level of exposure for UNPROTECTED customers on the TFL underground network is in my opinion no longer acceptable. Have you been aware of the excessive exposure to in-carriage noise your customers have to suffer from, and what are you going to do about it? FYI, The stretch concerned was on the Northern Line, from Camden Station to Euston Station, just after noon. But in my experience it is not just this stretch, nor is it just the Northern Line, that at times is literally deafening. Thank you for your email regarding my recent complaint about unbearable in-carriage noise levels on the Northern Line. I appreciate your explanation on noise levels in general. However, you have not commented at all on the specific information I supplied with my original complaint. In particular I would like your reaction to the noise level measured (100dB average, 111dB peak) as well as it's duration (well over ONE minute, being the majority of the trip between Camden and Euston). As I explained earlier, 111dB is FOUR HUNDRED times as loud as the noise level (85dB) from which your colleagues working on the lines are required by health and safety to wear equipment to protect their hearing. How is that going to work out for your customers, I wonder? Will they be issued equipment as well?! Awaiting your reply

I appreciate the noise that property owners above the tube have to deal with but as you are aware the actual tube carriages have not been updated to my knowledge in the last 30 odd years? I have no idea when the tracks are updated and I should imagine they are only repaired on a need to maintain basis? The pressure on the network must be intense due to the increase in commuters over the years. My opinion is the noise is a warning sign of an impending catastrophe. Please don't wait to rectify the situation after a derailment. The fact that there is no legal limit to the noise level is no reason for tfl to not regulate themselves. As the new regulations on air pollution come into affect, the underground will come under even greater pressure. I hope that you will be prepared? Yours sincerely

Hi, Thank you for your prompt response and explanation; this is helpful. However, I do not accept that the noise isn't dangerous or doesn't last long enough to cause any damage. Recently, the noise I've been experiencing has been very loud and also high pitched, so that it actually really hurts the ear drums. Also, if one travels long distances, the effect can be accumulative. The worst noise on the northern line appears to be between kentish town and camden town stations, and between London bridge and elephant and castle (including borough). Equally, it is painful to hear the bakerloo line approaching when waiting for it at Waterloo due to the highly high pitch friction noise. Is this a separate issue to the vibration that you've described? I look forward to hearing from you.

Only yesterday the driver of the northern line tube advised customers over the intercom to 'cover the ears, turn up the wifi set, or cover the ears' as it moved from Kings Cross to Euston. If the driver is offering advice over the matter for customers, why can't Transport for London do something of practical assistance, such as handing out ear plugs. Why must the customer pay for damaging sound as they travel? Academics have conducted scientific research providing evidence of how this noise level on London Transport is detrimental to an individual's health for regular travellers. Is London Transport going to continue to duck the issue and mislead travellers on the noise problem? The least you could do is to put up a public notice saying there is a problem but that it is being dealt with. In the meanwhile, customers will continue to cringe, clasp their ears, close their eyes, and hold their heads as they suffer on London Transport journeys. What a shame!
