To whom it may concern,

Lambeth Council is in the process of submitting its 2020 Annual Status Report (ASR) to the Greater London Authority. This is a report that we submit annually to update the GLA on our progresses in tackling air pollution in the borough. We are looking to submit the ASR next week.

We intend to publish the following paragraph in the ASR:

"Vauxhall air quality monitoring station LB5 has breached the annual mean objective of 40 µg m-3. This is the highest PM10 concentration ever recorded at the site. It is believed that the spikes recorded at the station since 2019 are due to contamination from a tube vent which belongs to Transport for London. The vent is situated immediately next to the air quality station's sensors; it was previously sealed, and has been left open since 2019. Lambeth has tried liaising multiple times with Transport for London asking that the vent was closed or that pollution coming from the vent was mitigated. The pollution from the vent is contaminating the readings, and we therefore believe those not to be representative of PM10 levels in the Vauxhall area. We continue to liaise with TfL to agree on a solution".

To whom it may concern,

I am looking into the ongoing issue of very high PM readings at our Vauxhall AQ station. The AQ team of Imperial College (former KCL's AQ team) confirmed the station is still exceeding. The automatic monitor is important in contributing to our monitoring of dust caused by new development, which is currently happening at a high density in Vauxhall. At the moment, we can't rely on the measurements of PM10 from the AQ station to help to indicate whether there are exceedances caused by demolition and construction practices. We are therefore pressured to solve this issue as soon as possible.

Could you please let us know if there has been any developments from your side to revolve this?
