

Dear Councillor Newens

Thank you for your most recent email to Claire Alleguen at TfL. I have been working with Councillor Rose to resolve the current communication matters we are having with the various departments at TfL and with our counterparts in Lambeth.

I am pleased to advise that Councillor Rose and myself had a productive meeting with Will Norman (Walking and Cycling Commissioner) on Friday 23rd September. Will understands the issues and also the difficulties dealing with the various areas of TfL.

Will has agreed to chair a meeting between Councillor Rose and her counterpart in Lambeth (Councillor Rezina Chowdhury). The intention is to establish clear lines of communication to ensure that councillors can obtain any required information, to agree the technical need of each area, and the joint communications going forward. This will require a better way of getting and sharing data with local councillors and residents. The current arrangements are not considered the most efficient as for instance Claire Alleguen would not be able to provide the majority of the information you are requesting, particularly as this would involve extensive investigation with Lambeth officers. It is understood and appreciated how frustrating this can be. Also, as I presume you can appreciate, we are dealing with three different areas of TfL (buses, traffic signals, scheme sponsorship).

I do understand why you would wish TfL to provide certain information about the wider causes of the congestion on Croxted Road. My personal opinion is that the dynamics and interactions of the various Streetspace measures implemented by Southwark and Lambeth, and the restrictions under the bridge at Herne Hill, are far too complex for any easy explanation of the congestion on Croxted Road. There could be a significant amount of investigation undertaken with no potential definitive result. I very much suspect that TfL are not willing to carry out this investigation, not least because of their current financial situation.

In the short term, TfL officers are not going to respond to requests for information from councillors and any such requests should go through officers. This is until we can agree the optimum way forward via the proposed meeting of Will Norman and respective Lead Cabinet Members.

Councillor Rose wished me to advise that she will be in contact with both yourself and Councillor Leeming prior to the meeting with Will Norman.

Subject: RE: Herne Hill Signal Intervention Report

Dear Claire,

Further to Richard's email below, I refer you to my request for information (of 13th June and 20th June) that I re-sent to you again yesterday as I have not yet received any reply.

In this request I have, once again, specifically highlighted the fact that both TfL data and Southwark Council data show that traffic volumes on Croxted Road during the AM peak remain consistently lower than they were pre-pandemic, as they have been throughout the post-lockdown period. I have asked, in these circumstances, for an explanation of why the congestion has increased.

As pointed out on numerous occasions, we know anecdotally that as traffic volumes rose coming out of lockdown and LTNs were introduced in Lambeth (including pavement widening under the Herne Hill Bridge), residents in the North Dulwich Triangle and on Turney Road and Burbage Road began to complain of increases in volumes of traffic. It seems highly likely that traffic was at that stage displaced from other areas into Dulwich Village. It follows that the measures later introduced in Dulwich Village simply halted that process.

In the light of the above and given the wide coverage of LTN interventions to the west of the borough boundary (which are far more extensive than those introduced in Dulwich Village), and the fact that traffic volumes are shown to have dropped on Croxted Road, like Richard I have yet to see any evidence to prove that the low traffic measures introduced in Dulwich Village are the sole cause of increased congestion.

Furthermore, it strikes me that a lazy assumption that the measures in Dulwich Village are the sole cause of increased congestion has hitherto stifled any inclination to properly investigate and understand the actual cause of the problem. Without such understanding I cannot see how the problem will be solved.

Once again, I call upon TfL to answer the questions that I have raised and to take account of the wider area when considering the causes of (and, therefore, the solutions to) the current congestion problems.

Thank you for this report, however I have some significant concerns with it and I'm not sure it's fit to release in its current form.

The report makes a number of assertions that are unproven and fails to mention many of the other changes to traffic infrastructure which have been implemented in the area.

My specific concerns are:

- Slide two describes the Dulwich scheme, but none of the scheme implemented in Lambeth are discussed. This omission on its own renders this report unpublishable
- The language on slide three is loose and could appear to describe the impact on bus journey times in Norwood Road and Croxted Road as a direct response to of the Dulwich scheme. There is no evidence to support this assertion and this must be removed

- The description of the root cause on Slide 6 makes claims that are partial and unevidenced – this cannot be published in its current form – it does not mention any of the schemes introduced elsewhere - nor does it mention the aspects of the work in Southwark that prevents traffic from the south-east joining Croxted Road
- No data is provided to support the assertion in the first bullet point on slide 7

Please could you address these points and reissue the report. Thank you

There are various issues and mistakes made in relation to how it was sent out to residents, which I am addressing with officers in Southwark. But the fundamental issue is how TfL approached the piece of work, which was intended to show improvements over time to bus journeys as a result of recent interventions. Instead we have a narrative of TfL being deemed to have passed a guilty verdict on the Dulwich Streetspace scheme. This has set our work back with this community on Croxted Road years in effect.

I have written to colleagues directly involved in TfL and Lambeth via the Herne Hill working group, which Helen Hayes MP chairs, setting out my concerns. I have attached this email to this message.

I hope to catch up with you to also talk about the positives in the borough and our plans for the years ahead. This latest incident is indicative of some of the issues we continue to face dealing with TfL at times.
