

HSE Bulletin 55 in 2017 Use of mobile electronic devices in train cabs

Background

The use by drivers of personal mobile phones has been cited as a factor in several fatal railway incidents around the globe, including disasters in Spain, Germany and California claiming over a hundred lives. More recently the driver's use of a mobile phone in the cab was referred to in an investigation into a serious PTI incident on First Great Western at Hayes & Harlington. In response to this incident, The Rail Accident Investigation Branch (RAIB) reminded TOCs that the use of mobile phones by drivers "creates an unacceptable risk of distraction and is therefore dangerous".

Instruction

Train Operators are reminded that, as per the Train Operations Competence Standards and Guidance:

Personal mobile phones (and other personal electronic devices) must be switched off at all times while driving in the cab.

Using a mobile device while in control of your train is considered a breach of the Code of Conduct Standard, and if found proven could result in disciplinary action being taken.
