

But a resident advised me to look at the PVR calculations at http://www.londonbusroutes.net/details.htm, together with a Google distance calculator suggests that the reduction in the D3 & 135 bus routes will save TfL 5.3 buses.

The suggested extension of the D6 down Manchester road and then up Eastferry to ASDA costs 5.6 PVR based on an additional distance of 3.6 kilometers.

So the net cost is 1/3 of a bus.

Thanks for discussing this this afternoon.

As mentioned, I did suggest route D8 could be used for transfers, and in fact originally set up the web page entry for this change to state this – see below. However, as the Fares Notice (attached) didn't mention route D8 I thought it best to remove it from the options listed.

The suggestion you mentioned to allow free transfer to and from the DLR is a good one in my opinion (for those who can and are happy to use the DLR) as this (as well as route D8) opens up access to Asda at Crossharbour which is not served by route D7. Interchange from route D6 to the DLR could be at either All Saints or Blackwall. However I don't know how this would be arranged in practice and suggest you contact Ken Parr's team (Maria, Julia, Louise) who probably have contacts at the DLR.

However, a simpler (bus-only) solution would be to expand the free transfer arrangements to route D8 as this also allows access to Asda.

Please let me know the outcome so I can update my end.

From the 27th March we are losing D6 from the Isle of Dogs & 135 buses from Marsh Wall / Manchester due to the gas works which for 5 weeks will shut down Marsh Wall east and Eastferry.

TfL are now advertising the following diversions for this period;

Subject: Bus interruption Isle of Dogs from 27th March for 5 weeks

"Routes 135 and D6 are on diversion until Monday 1st May due to roadworks at Marsh Wall, E14. Route 135 diverted via Spindrift Avenue, East Ferry Road and Crossharbour Bus Stand both ways. Route D6 running to and from Blackwall Station and unable to serve stops south of here."

This causes several major issues

- 1. Loss of D6 to island all together
- 2. Manchester road only served by one bus route D7

Not forgetting in 2015/2016 the regular interruptions to Manchester road bus services due to the repeated Thames Water road closures for water mains failures.



I guessed that the £3 3m was for a whole bus service rather then one bus stop Do we get a reduction if not all of the £3 3m is required as there are other things locally we can spend that money on? The Isle of Dogs will be the densest place in western Europe, large parts will be denser then Manhattan Millharbour as of 2014 was the densest place in the UK with a population density equivalent to 92,000 people per hectare according to the Office for National Statistics and there is a lot more under construction
So I think you will find that once we have done some more work on the air quality implications of what is happening that we will be insisting on electric only key routes in the area The island will not be like the rest of London, not even Nine Elms or Stratford will be as dense as us
The 3D pictures (below) we produced in 2015 shows as of that date all expected development in the area (where we had pictures from developers) of what will be coming New buildings in colour and existing in white

I was aware that we'd secured contributions for bus services but am not aware that the money has been triggered. There is a process in place whereby TfL planning colleagues periodically contact the Council about the status of \$106 funding. With regard to your earlier reference to the Council having £82m in \$106, I suspect only a small amount applies to bus services and the conditions attached probably means it is not eligible to be spent on buses to Orchard Place. You will be aware that \$106 contributions are funding the current 9 bph frequency on route D7 which respondents to lested of Dogs consultation were very keen to maintain.

With regard to the £3.3m connected to London City Island, I should clarify that the money relates in the main to bus services (which are expensive) as opposed to a bus

stop (which is relatively cheap). At the time of the negotiations – circa 2010 – colleagues were working on the assumption that the most likely scenario would be a need to extend the 277 from Clove Crescent to Orchard Place or extend something from Canning Town. t looks like agreement was reached on a contribution equivalent to 3 buses in a schedule. At the time this would have had a typical cost of £660,000. We typically seek funding for 5 years which makes £3 3m. In 2010 we could not reasonably have been expected to be evicted from Clove Crescent or that there would be much acceptance of bus services being removed from the town hall.

The enforcement of the bus gate in Blackwall Way will be the responsibility of the Council. I don't think there will be a physical barrier and assume the gate will be enforced by CCTV. If so, it may be that the camera will be able to capture vehicles using the pavement should it become an issue.

With regard to Asda, a cleaner bus fleet is a priority of the Mayor and as part of that electric buses will become more numerous although hybrid buses are expected to make up the majority of the fleet. Therefore its difficult to guarantee electric buses on specific routes. I don't know much about the engineering side of things but I would guess that the charging equipment is quite specialised. For example, we are currently trialling induction loops on route 69 at Canning Town station rather than the plug in chargers that cars use.
