Joe Baker
Head of Carbon Management



Joe leads the Councils work to deliver a Zero Carbon Borough by 2050. This work focuses on household and business emissions, but the transport sector (which is responsible for 23% of the boroughs carbon emissions) needs to be reduced if the borough is to realise its Zero Carbon ambition. Joe also plays a leading role in the Councils response on electric vehicles, and manages the Wood Green Neighbourhood for the Future programme. Because of his knowledge and experience, he is the borough lead on a pan-London group with the GLA and TfL, delivering a steps change in uptake for alternative fuelled vehicles through policy and project development. In a previous role he also managed the delivery of the City of Westminster's Alternative Fuelled Vehicles, Cycling, and Walking Strategies. And was involved in public realm improvements in Oxford Street, Soho, and Covent Garden.

Active Communities and
Health Manager



Denise is the Active Communities and Health Manager at Haringey. She is responsible for the Smarter Travel behaviour change programme and for encouraging people to be more physically active in the Borough.

She has worked on five behaviour change personal travel planning projects targeted at residents and schools in order to promote a modal shift to more sustainable travel and a range of projects and campaigns including the current Haringey Walks campaign and projects and activities to support more people cycling within the borough.

Denise sits on the Board of Modeshift which is a national organisation that exists to share best practise in sustainable travel delivery.
