London's toxic air contributes to thousands of early deaths each year and is putting the health of children at risk. The Ultra Low Emission Zone (ULEZ) is central to the Mayor's plans to transform the air that millions of Londoners breathe.

The central London ULEZ was expanded on 25 October 2021 to create a single larger zone covering the area up to, but not including the North Circular Road (A406) and South Circular Road (A205).

The ULEZ operates 24 hours a day, seven days a week, except Christmas Day (25 December). Vehicles, must meet the strict emission standards to be driven within the ULEZ without payment of a charge.

Full details of the ULEZ, including the emission standards, are available on our website, **tfl.gov.uk/ulez**

On DOFF your vehicle VRM, which according to our records is subject to the ULEZ and non-compliant with the emissions standards, was seen being driven in the ULEZ without having paid the appropriate charge.

On this occasion you have been sent a Warning Notice rather than a Penalty Charge Notice (PCN).

While we have decided not to issue a PCN on this occasion we reserve the right to issue a penalty for any future contraventions.

To help improve air quality we would prefer vehicle owners to drive vehicles that meet the emission standards or, where possible, use public transport, cycle or walk.

If you believe that your vehicle meets the required emission standards, please visit our website, **tfl.gov.uk/ulez** where you can make an enquiry or upload evidence to confirm your vehicle meets the standards.

If you wish to continue using your vehicle in the ULEZ you will need to pay a daily ULEZ charge. The charge is £12.50. If no charge is paid a PCN may be issued.

The Driver and Vehicle Licensing Agency (DVLA) provided your details as the registered keeper of the vehicle. TfL are not able to change these details, so if you are no longer the registered keeper of the vehicle you should contact the DVLA and advise them of who is now the registered keeper.
