Variation Recommendation

- 1. Introduction / Executive Summary
 - 1.1 Approval is sought to proceed with the proposed variation as outlined in this paper.
 - 1.2 The purpose of the contract is mid-life overhaul of two escalators at Custom House & two escalators at London City Airport. The contract was later varied to include mid-life overhaul of four poorly maintained escalators at Cutty Sark station following their transfer from City Greenwich Lewisham Rail Link (CGLR) to DLR on expiry of their concession. Cutty Sark is a section 12 station where escalators form part of the evacuation with two escalators out of service causing severe disruptions at a very busy DLR station with high passenger flow. The supplier is KONE Public Limited Company.
 - 1.3 It is recommended that the current procurement authority for contract be increased to a value of £1,102,608 comprising the following elements:
 - a) Initial Contract Value £307,015
 - b) Previously approved Variations Value £639,701
 - c) Current Variation £117,892
 - d) Allowance of risk totalling £38,000; and

It is further recommended that the variation for the contract known as Mid-Life Overhaul of Escalators at Custom House & London City Airport be awarded to KONE Public Limited Company in the total sum of £117,892

This variation has no impact on the Contract Completion Date

1.4 Procurement Authority to the value of £1,102,608is hereby requested. This request for approval represents a Procurement Authority increase of £61,220 on the previously approved Procurement Authority of £1,041,388

The DPA holder, by signing this paper, confirms that the requested Procurement Authority is granted herewith.

By indicating agreement and / or signing this paper, stakeholders and signatories also confirm their endorsement of the proposed approach.

1.5 As the escalators at Cutty Sarks get dismantled for overhaul, the poor condition of parts which were invisible becomes apparent and this variation contains those items which were DLR risk under the contract.

The cost of repair was initially quoted to cost £127k and agreed at £118k which is expected to result in approximately £9k efficiency savings.





- 2. Permitted Reason for Modification / Variation & Additional Details Around Scope & Governance of Proposed Variation
- 2.1 The proposed variation does not entail any changes to the terms and conditions of the contract. This request for Procurement Authority uplift is to cover for the change which is to be administered via the defined change mechanism (NEC3 Compensation Event process).
- 2.2 The permitted reason for modification is (e) Non-substantial changes.



4. Background & Current Status

4.1. On 22nd July 2021, DLR entered contract with KONE Public Limited Company to carry out mid-life overhaul of (2nr) escalators at Custom House & (2nr) escalators at London City Airport following a competitive tender process for the works based on NEC Option A, at a fixed price contract totalling £307,015 with a completion date of 31st January 2022. All these works are now completed.

Prior to handover of site at Custom House station, the escalators were found to have been vandalised. 2nr controllers, 2nr invertors, cabinets and control equipment were required







as replacements. The variation also included 2nr right-hand and left-hand side at the lower landing that need access restriction devices fitted, Inr. Left hand side of the escalator requires a ceiling intersection guard fitted to the new steel, 2nr. deflectors to be fitted at each side of the escalator on the upper landing to the new static balustrades, 3nr floor plates replaced and fitted, 2nr. stop units relocated between the two escalators and manufacture new bases. All these cost £28k (negotiated down from £32k).

There was a second variation totalling £489,920 involving expanding the scope of work to include mid-life overhaul of the (4nr) escalators at Cutty Sark, replacing life expired components to extend life and increase reliability. These escalators were not included in previous procurement of escalators overhaul contracts because they were on the DLR's Lewisham extension which was being managed by CGLR but has since then been transferred to DLR. Prior to start of overhaul of the 4 nr. Cutty Sark escalators, additional items of work which were identified while overhaul of Custom House and London City Airport escalators was being carried out were added to the scope as a cost of £121,780

The current variations are additional scope totalling £117,892.26 which reflects items of work which have further been identified when the overhaul of 4nr Cutty Sark escalators has begun. As stated above, these assets were poorly maintained by CGLR and were already out of service by the time they were handed over to DLR.

- 4.2. Project change control has been completed and the sponsor has confirmed funding is available in respect of this variation. The source of funding is from the DLR 10 Year Plan Renewals line for Lifts and Escalators budget line.
- 4.3. By approving this paper TfL will be committing to spending an additional £117,892 with the supplier. This will be instructed as a lump sum variation under NEC3 Option A contract.
- 4.4. See below the current and planned expenditure for the term of the variation in the table below. The table shows the split between what the current and planned spend is for both external, i.e. contractors, and internal costs.

4.5. None of the above costs are retrospective. A clear process of monitoring procurement authority levels is in place and being followed.

5. Strategic Objectives and Considerations

- 5.1. The consequence of not proceeding with this variation is an increased risk of death or serious injuries of commuters in case of fire outbreak or other safety incidents. The overhaul is safety, security and operationally critical.
- 5.2. Approval of this submission would allow DLR to meet its 10-year business plan objectives.

6.1 The quotations were checked for any arithmetic errors and compliance to contracted fees and no errors were found. The rates used in pricing were in accordance with the contract. The initial quotation submitted by Kone Plc totalled £126,935.41 but the final agreed cost for the proposed variation was £117,892.26 thereby achieving a £9,043.15 efficiency savings which is recorded on the contracts register.

- 7.1 We will continue managing the contract in line with the conditions of contract and this variation does not introduce any new clauses to the contract.

 - 9.1 Cutty Sark is a section 12 station and having 2 escalators out of service is a safety and operational risk. In addition, until these escalators are repaired and accepted by the franchisee, Keolis Amey Dockland, they will be carved out from the performance regime.
