RE: A217 Junction with Lumley Road

We are writing to inform you that following our meeting with Paul Scully MP, London Assembly Member Steve O'Connell, Transport for London (TfL) and Sutton Council about the A217 junction with Lumley Road, TfL have now agreed funding to look at making this junction safer.

They will be installing a camera opposite the junction to identify if and where there are problems, taking account of near misses and accidents that often don't get reported.

After a few months, they will report their findings and suggest what, if anything, needs to be done to improve safety at this junction.

We are pleased that following our intervention, they have agreed to take this issue seriously and we look forward to hearing their report.

We have also asked if there is a weight limit for vehicles on Lumley Road, which there aren't at this stage. However, the Council are trialling a new automatic camera enforcement system in Beddington for weight restrictions, and if it proves worthwhile, may be looking for other places to install it.

We will keep you update, but please get in touch if you need any further information.

Observations/ discussion points (Cllr Colburn relayed the concerns from residents)

- Three speed limits in close proximity
 - St Dunstan's Road (TLRN) – 40mph road, dual carriageway
 - Red lines at junction with Lumley Road – 30mph
 - Lumley Road - 20mph zone (LBS)
- There is the perception that local residents have difficulty and find it dangerous to exit Lumley Road on to St Dunstan's Road due to speed of oncoming traffic, some of which are large vehicles and finding gaps to turn out

- In particular, it is difficult for vehicles to turn right
- Hatched central reservation is narrow, vehicles often straddle lanes while waiting
- Residents had mentioned that they avoid the junction as it is unsafe for their use
- Noted existing speed camera advisory sign is hidden by trees
- Collision reports show right-hand turns as a main course of incidence
- Suggestions locally included
 - closing off the junction to traffic
 - making the junction left turn only
- Noted some other side roads already closed to traffic (i.e. Love Lane) or banned turns (Churchill Road)
- Need to consider the impact of local restrictions to traffic, in particular for Cheam Village

Queries

- Speed camera located at the next junction. Is this working?
- Do we know details yet of collision in May that saw a vehicle land on its roof

Actions

TfL to:

- Arrange video and speed surveys at the junction – seek funding
- Collate evidence for initial feasibility work – seek funding
- Enquire whether the speed camera advisory sign can be re-sited before the junction with Lumley Road to help deter speeding
- Review 40mph repeater signs to check they are in the correct locations, coming away from the A217/A232 junction

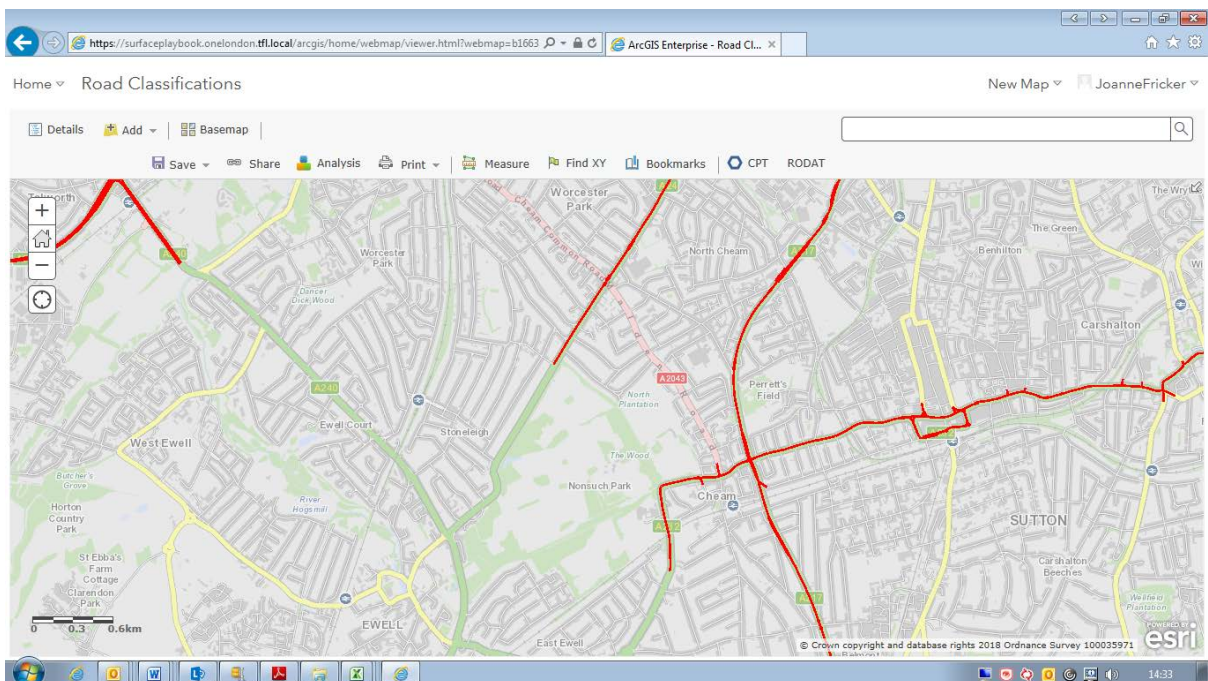

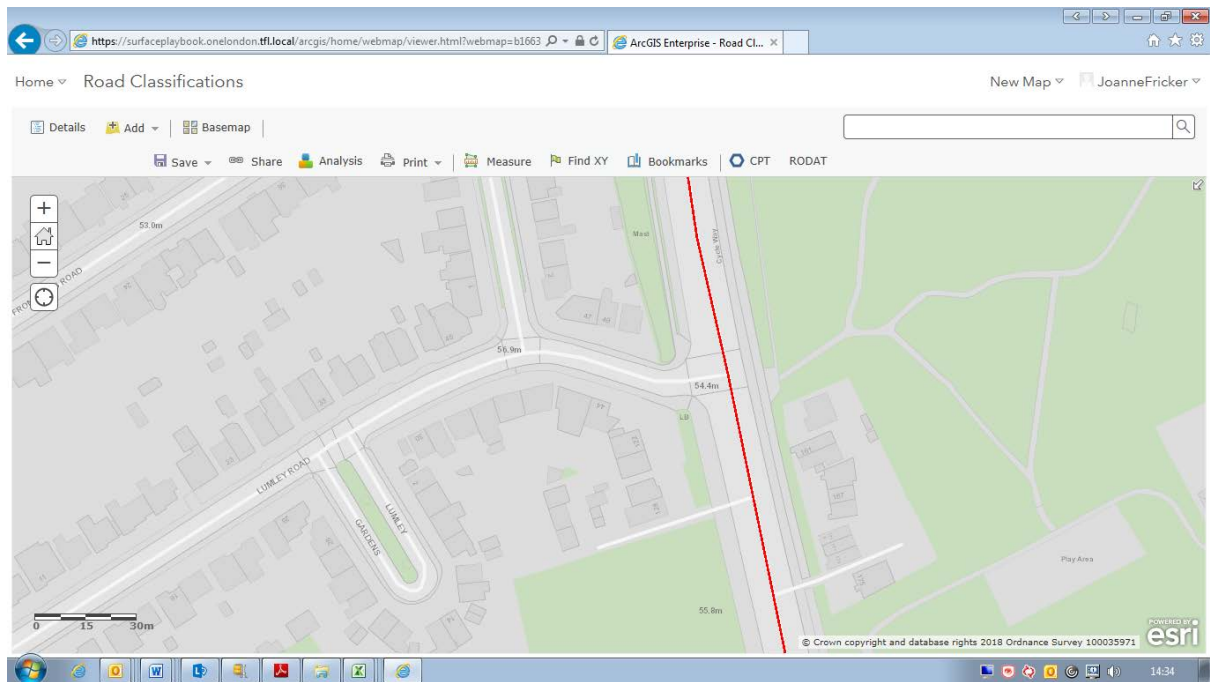

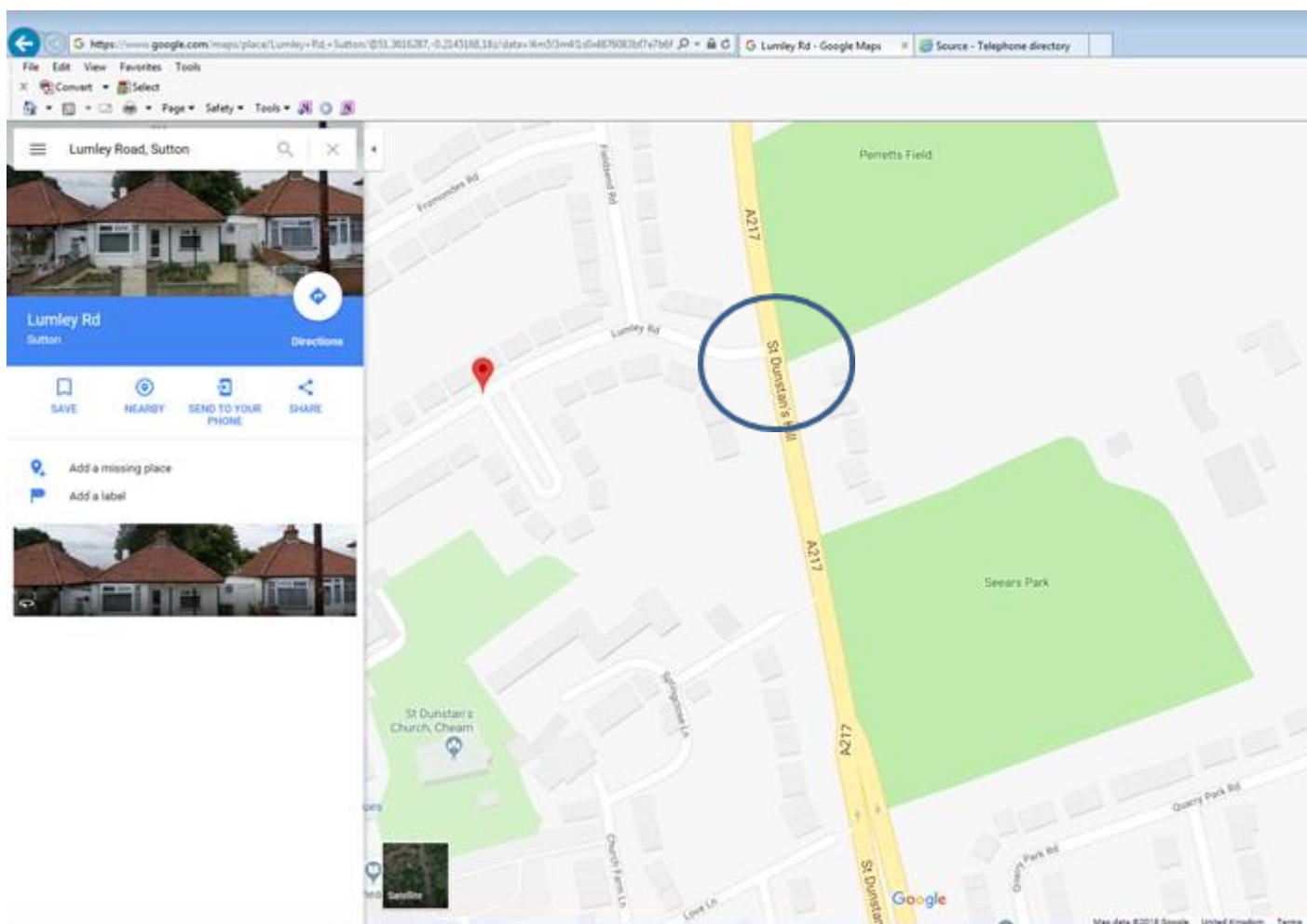

I visited the site late July this year but did not notice any anomalies but may have confused the location with another enquiry requesting a concave mirror. Along with previous collision data listed 5 slight collisions over a 3 year period upto July 2017.

My visit to the location was late morning on 24th July with very light traffic flow and limited vehicle turning movements. Sorry I cannot find images from the day at this particular site. But noted that there is a cycle track on footway i.e. wide footway which would improve visibility for approaching traffic.

Historic stream of responses regarding this location set out below and our previous comments regarding this location. Concerns sparked from a collision occurring May 2018.

- Latest PIA collisions resulting in slight within the last 12 months 36 months upto Jan 2018. Has something changed at this location?
- Majority of the collisions occur with vehicles exiting the side road (Lumley Road) to turn right onto A217. A217 being 4 lanes of traffic, 2 lanes each direction.
- 3 out of the 9 collisions (33%) involving powered two wheelers.

The borough can advise on the rat running and areas of avoidance especially during peak times.

Borough action - If the turning movement exiting Lumley Road is to be banned. [Borough (traffic authority) to raise TRO and seek a S8 for signage on TLRN (highway authority)]

TfL action - If the turning movement into Lumley Road is to be banned [TfL to raise TRO and provide signage on TLRN]

From the outcome of collisions this may be more of a borough action rather than TfL. S8 request will be dealt with by our Highways Authority team i.e. Highways TAA etc.

Observations/ discussion points (Cllr Colburn relayed the concerns from residents)

- Three speed limits in close proximity
 - St Dunstan's Road (TLRN) – 40mph road, dual carriageway
 - Red lines at junction with Lumley Road – 30mph
 - Lumley Road - 20mph zone (LBS)
- There is the perception that local residents have difficulty and find it dangerous to exit Lumley Road on to St Dunstan's Road due to speed of oncoming traffic, some of which are large vehicles and finding gaps to turn out
- In particular, it is difficult for vehicles to turn right

- Hatched central reservation is narrow, vehicles often straddle lanes while waiting
- Residents had mentioned that they avoid the junction as it is unsafe for their use
- Noted existing speed camera advisory sign is hidden by trees
- Collision reports show right-hand turns as a main course of incidence
- Suggestions locally included
 - closing off the junction to traffic
 - making the junction left turn only
- Noted some other side roads already closed to traffic (i.e. Love Lane) or banned turns (Churchill Road)
- Need to consider the impact of local restrictions to traffic, in particular for Cheam Village

Queries

- Speed camera located at the next junction. Is this working?
- Do we know details yet of collision in May that saw a vehicle land on its roof

Actions

TfL to:

- Arrange video and speed surveys at the junction – seek funding
- Collate evidence for initial feasibility work – seek funding
