



Good morning,

I am a reporter for the News Shopper in south east London, I hope you are well.

I have been in contact with multiple people who have received NIPs after 'speeding along the A20'.

The issue relates particularly to the **A20 Eastbound, West of Sandy Lane, east of Cookham Road**.

Drivers have said that before December 28, this area was a 70mph road which changed into a 50mph, but it has now dropped down to 40mph.

Despite this, drivers were not made aware of the sudden change, and have since received speeding tickets.

Some of these drivers could face losing their homes, jobs, going to court, bans, financial hardship and much more, so I would really appreciate someone could look at this issue and get back to me.

Here are the main issues surrounding the road:

- Only one side of the carriageway is 40mph
- There has been no layout change since the signage
- Sat Nav's and Google Maps are still displaying a speed limit of 70mph
- There has been no "grace period" once it went live on December 28
- There is a '50mph' sign located on this part of the road, which could be confusing to drivers.

Many people have reached out to me regarding their concerns. Here are a few stand out quotes: "It has also been brought to our attention that a 50mph sign has been erected in between two 40mph signs, which is extremely confusing for drivers and does not make it explicitly clear which speed we are supposed to be driving (please see image attached).

"Not to mention, the drastic change in speed limit is incredibly unsafe for that type of road."


"This is affecting a majority with clean licences, jobs, careers, children etc who all need their licence to work and ultimately survive if they're looking at disqualifications and being made unemployed as a result - It'll affect the mental and the physical health of those involved."

"I have had a clean license for the 12 years I have been driving, so you can imagine the stress and upset this has caused. I thought given I have no previous convictions I could do a speed awareness course for my first NIP I received however I was travelling 53mph so I think this means I will be punished with points and a fine, I have two other NIP's and a possible one other coming. I will also lose my job, my home and will not be able to financially take care of my 2-year-old. I have worked hard all my life, bought my own home, and kept a stable job throughout my adult years for this all to be taken away from me because of poor signage."

Please could you provide a statement regarding the above by 12pm tomorrow (January 25).

I understand that this is a complex case so please let me know if you need more time.





A TfL spokesperson said: "S afety is our number one priority and we have temporarily introduced a 40mph speed limit on the A20 S idcup R oad due to ongoing surface water flooding and water sheeting which has caused a number of safety concerns. This presents a serious risk to road users and this reduced speed limit will stay in place until permanent drainage measures can be installed.

"The new speed limit signage is compliant with the traffic sign regulations, and has been approved by the Metropolitan Police Service. Additional temporary signage has also been installed to ensure drivers are aware of the change in speed limit."

Subject: A20 Eastbound sped limit change - statement request

Good morning,

I am a reporter for the News Shopper in south east London, I hope you are well.

I have been in contact with multiple people who have received NIPs after 'speeding along the A20'.

The issue relates particularly to the **A20 Eastbound, West of Sandy Lane, east of Cookham Road**.

Drivers have said that before December 28, this area was a 70mph road which changed into a 50mph, but it has now dropped down to 40mph.

Despite this, drivers were not made aware of the sudden change, and have since received speeding tickets.

Some of these drivers could face losing their homes, jobs, going to court, bans, financial hardship and much more, so I would really appreciate someone could look at this issue and get back to me.

#### Here are the main issues surrounding the road:

- Only one side of the carriageway is 40mph
- There has been no layout change since the signage
- Sat Nav's and Google Maps are still displaying a speed limit of 70mph
- There has been no "grace period" once it went live on December 28
- There is a '50mph' sign located on this part of the road, which could be confusing to drivers.

Many people have reached out to me regarding their concerns. Here are a few stand out quotes: "It has also been brought to our attention that a 50mph sign has been erected in between two 40mph signs, which is extremely confusing for drivers and does not make it explicitly clear which speed we are supposed to be driving (please see image attached).

"Not to mention, the drastic change in speed limit is incredibly unsafe for that type of road."

"This is affecting a majority with clean licences, jobs, careers, children etc who all need their licence to work and ultimately survive if they're looking at disqualifications and being made unemployed as a result - It'll affect the mental and the physical health of those involved."

"I have had a clean license for the 12 years I have been driving, so you can imagine the stress and upset this has caused. I thought given I have no previous convictions I could do a speed awareness course for my first NIP I received however I was travelling 53mph so I think this means I will be punished with points and a fine, I have two other NIP's and a possible one other coming. I will also lose my job, my home and will not be able to financially take care of my 2-year-old. I have worked hard all my life, bought my own home, and kept a stable job throughout my adult years for this all to be taken away from me because of poor signage."

Please could you provide a statement regarding the above by 12pm tomorrow (January 25).

I understand that this is a complex case so please let me know if you need more time.
