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## Bike-to-school competition

### Our story

The school's YTA are running another cycle to school week, specifically targeted at Years 7 and 8 - 192 participants will be involved. Girls are encouraged to cycle every day of the week, with a bikers brunch planned for cyclists on the Friday.

## Car-free zone

### Our story

The school, in response to concerns raised by local residents, has introduced a safe drop off zone, where parents are directed to drop off their children away from the main school entrance and are routed in a one-way system away from the school, to reduce congestion and improve safety for girls arriving by foot and on bike.

## Bike Week

### Our story

The school held a cycle to school week - girls were encouraged to cycle through the use of a stamp book - every day they cycled they received a stamp. 46 girls and members of staff cycled every day of the week and received a free breakfast on the Friday morning.
